Sun Protection

As we enjoy the warm weather, it's important to remember the significance of sun protection for our children. With the extreme heat, children are more vulnerable to heat-related issues like dehydration and heat stroke. Our Educators are ensuring that sun safety is integrated into our program planning. A sunscreen station is set up in the service and children are reminded to reapply sunscreen every 2 hours and 20 minutes before outdoor play. Supervision is crucial in ensuring children are protected from the sun. Educators model good sun safety practices, especially during outdoor activities. Educators understand the UV Index is important, and any ratings over level 3 require sun protection measures. Sun safety resources, including posters are available around the service, and they are used as discussion starters in children's meetings. Let's work together to keep our children safe and healthy under the sun!

At OSHClub, our number one priority is that we keep your children safe. To do so, we need to make sure that they are being dropped off and collected appropriately. When dropping off it is important that guardians walk their child to the door. This ensures that they make it here safely and allows us to potentially communicate any vital information. Collection of children is even more important as we need to ensure that your child is going home with the correct person. If you or a family member has never collected your child before, we will need to see ID and ensure they are authorised to pick up. If you do need someone different to collect your child as a one off, please let us know in writing with their full name. If you have any further questions regarding this policy - please let us know!

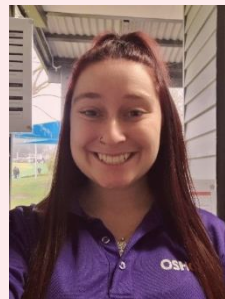
