Policy

Medical conditions

Ensuring the health and safety of all children is a priority at our OSHClub, especially regarding medical conditions and needs. Parents now have the convenience of updating their child's enrolment record through Kidsoft's new feature. However, it is vital that any changes made are also communicated directly to the Service Leader for accurate documentation updates.

Medical documentation plays a crucial role in enabling us to cater effectively to children's health and additional needs during their time with us. It is mandatory that all medical documentation and medication information is current before children attend sessions. Failure to update these records may prevent a child from participating until updated documentation is provided.

To support families, services will provide adequate notice before the expiration of medical documentation or medication, allowing parents time to visit a GP or refill prescriptions before the next booking. Service Leaders conduct regular audits of medical records each term to ensure ongoing compliance and accuracy.

When administering medication, strict procedures are followed to ensure safety. Medications must match the documentation provided by a General Practitioner and require verification by two educators. Storage protocols are also rigorous to prevent crosscontamination and maintain efficacy. Any changes in medication dosage or medical management must be accompanied by updated documentation from a GP to prioritize the child's health needs.

By adhering to these policies and procedures, we ensure that our OSHClub maintains a safe and supportive environment where every child's health and wellbeing are diligently cared for.
